



## Legal Resources

In Winter 2000, UC Santa Barbara's Associated Students opened the Legal Resource Center as a result of a student initiative to provide free legal counseling services to the campus community. Since 2000, the Legal Resource Center has helped UCSB students identify and resolve legal matters by offering legal information, education, consultation, and coaching services.

The Legal Resource Center attorney is available to provide support for legal matters to all registered UCSB students on many issues including landlord/tenant disputes, contracts, personal injury matters, consumer complaints, credit and debt problems, family law, motor vehicle tickets, employment issues, criminal citations, wills and probate, and traffic accidents.

Although the Legal Resource Center does not provide formal legal representation, staff can provide students with a referral to a local attorney. Additionally, the Legal Resource Center cannot assist in conflicts between two or more UCSB students or between a UCSB student and the University.

## Student Focus Disabled Students Program

Every year, many temporarily and permanently disabled students attend UC Santa Barbara. Student Affairs' Disabled Students Program (DSP) ensures that these students always receive the same core support academic services as other students at UC Santa Barbara.

The office provides academic support services to students with documented long-term or temporary disabilities, including both visible (mobility issues, blind or low vision, deaf or hearing loss) and hidden (learning, ADD/ADHD, psychological disabilities, and chronic or acute health issues).

The Disabled Students Program provides a wide variety of academic accommodations for students. As appropriate, these may include note takers, exam accommodations, and technological equipment such as speech screen readers, Braille printing, Assistive Listening Devices, and voice recognition equipped laptops.

All students can help support the Disabled Students Program by reporting issues or hazards on campus that may affect students living with disabilities, including elevator outages, pathway obstructions, and other equipment problems. Another way your student can support disabled students at UC Santa Barbara is to apply for a position as a paid note taker.

Students are responsible for contacting the Disabled Students Program and providing documentation of disabilities.
